1. Definitions

In this scheme:

"the charity" means the charity identified at the beginning of this scheme.

"the Commission" means the Charity Commission for England and Wales.

"effective date" means 2 January 2018 (or such later date as the 2016 trustees (meaning the trustees of the charity appointed under the existing governing document) may before 2 January 2018 resolve to be the date with effect from which the transfer of the funds and other property of the charity (identified in part 2 of the schedule) from the charity to the charitable company should take place)

"existing governing document" means the scheme made by the First Tier Tribunal 14 December 2016 in relation to the charity.

"the charitable company" means Bath Recreation Limited (charity number 1173521 and company number 10735297).

"the trustees", where used in part 3 of the schedule, means the directors of the charitable company.

2. Administration

- (1) The charity is to be administered in accordance with its existing governing document as altered or affected by this scheme.
- The clauses or parts of clauses in the existing governing document listed in part 3 of the schedule shall cease to have effect at the date of this scheme.
- (3) Any reference to "the Trustees" in the existing governing document shall read "the Trustee", and any related wording implying Trustees in the plural shall read as being a reference to the Trustee in the singular, with effect from the effective date of this scheme.
- (4) The provisions of this scheme will take effect on the effective date.

3. Trustee

- (1) The charitable company is appointed by this scheme as the trustee of the charity, under para 3(1) schedule 7 Charities Act 2011, and will administer it in accordance with its own administrative procedures.
- (2) In its capacity as trustee of the charity, the charitable company will hold the property identified in part 1 of the schedule in trust for the charity.

(3) From the effective date, the funds and other property of the charity (identified in part 2 of the schedule) are transferred to the charitable company to be held as part of the corporate property of the charitable company.

4. Questions relating to the Scheme

The Commission may decide any question put to it concerning:

- (1) the interpretation of this scheme; or
- (2) the propriety or validity of anything done or intended to be done under it.

Clause 18 - the quorum required for trustees' meetings is confirmed in Article 9.3. This reflects the requirements set out in the existing governing document.

Clause 19 - the procedure in respect of voting at Trustees' meetings is contained in Article 9.7 and 9.8. This reflects the requirements set out in the existing governing document.

Clause 20 - the requirement for Trustees to act independently is contained in Article 8.10 and 15.6. This reflects the provisions set out in the existing governing document.

Clause 21 - the framework for declaring and managing conflicts of interest are contained in Articles 15 to 17. The provisions in the existing governing documenthave been updated in the Articles to reflect that the Trustees as directors will owe specific duties under company law in respect of conflicts.
